
- Psyche: soul

Depth Psychologists

- Freud: raised in Chassidic culture, familiar with Kabbalistic texts in his youth, proclaimed atheist, founder of psychoanalysis.
- Adler: holistic, will-to-power, socialistic; theories on (over)compensation and superiority/inferiority complexes...
- Jung: Freud's protégé who later left the "inner circle" based fundamentally on Jung's mystical understanding of the psyche.

"Adler, Jung, and Freud have given onto psychiatry the A, B, C's of scientific criminology."



Introspective Analysis

We can investigate ourselves, we can introvert ourselves, but when we attempt to, the difficulty of counter-transference emerges. The solution to this difficulty lies in knowing how to transfer our attention inward, with the purpose of exploring ourselves in order to know ourselves and to eliminate the negative values that harm us psychologically, socially, economically, politically, and even spiritually.

...how can the force of counter-transference be overcome? This can only be possible by means of transactional analysis and structural analysis.

Structural Analysis: Ego States

- Exteropsychic: These are the identifying states that are intimately related with the exterior perceptions. These are received through the five senses and are connected with the world of impressions.
- Neopsychic: These are the data processing states, in other words, states that properly interpret or misinterpret all the multiple situations that the intellectual animal lives. Our personality works like a bad secretary in these neopsychic states.
- Archeopsychic: These are the regressive states (memory of the ego)
 that are found in the 49 levels of the subconsciousness. They are the
 memories of the past that are filed in a photographic and phonographic
 manner.

Transactional Analysis

- Where is the energy coming from?
- What is it occurring?
- What is gained, what is exchanged?
- Between one structure and another structure
 - Interpsychic: between my mind and another mind?
 - Intrapsychic: between one structure of my mind and another structure of my mind?

Classical Transference & Counter-transference

Transference

- The subject of analysis transfers values erroneously on to the therapist.
 - E.g.: The patient unconsciously treats the therapist like their father or mother.
- Transference analysis brings to light the unconsciousness.

Counter-transference

- The therapist erroneously transfers values upon the subject of analysis.
 - E.g.: The therapist unconsciously treats the client like their spouse.
- A therapist's unconscious reaction to the client sabotages or limits his/her therapeutic capacity.

Introspective Transference & Counter-transference

Transference

- Attention is transferred inwardly towards the values which are unconsciously animated.
- Transference analysis brings to light the manifestations of unconsciousness.

Counter-transference

 The therapist (consciousness) erroneously becomes identified upon the subject of analysis (unconscious ego).

Methodology

- Discovery: when the ego has been seen in action, in manifestation.
- Judgment or comprehension: when all of the ego's roots are known.
- Execution: with the help of the Divine Mother Kundalini, through the wise practice of Sexual Super-dynamics, the ego is eliminated.
